### Privacy Room for Parents with Infants

Rosh Hashanah (RH) Day 1 & 2, Yom Kippur, during services  
*Privacy Room (off the Phillips Sanctuary)*

Use this quiet space to relax with your infant, while following the service which is visible through the window, with audio piped in. Our ushers are happy to direct you to this room. *Please note, because of restrictions on our license from the Department of Human Services, we do not provide childcare for children under the age of 24 months.*



### Happy Birthday World! (Children ages 2 – Pre-K)

Designed for our "youngest congregants", this program, led by adult staff, offers structured activities based on the High Holidays. The program combines crafts, large motor activities, apple and honey tasting, music and stories. Children will also participate in an age-appropriate mini-service. ### Gimel Family Service (Families with children in grades K-4)

The Gimel Family Service is a lively, creative, musical service led by Rabbi Yonatan Sadoff and Steve Mintz (on guitar.) Within the traditional framework of High Holiday prayers, we engage children with stories, songs, and lively questions. We offer parents and children a spiritually satisfying High Holiday worship service. **There is no fee. Children must be accompanied by an adult.**



### Turning a New Leaf (Children in grades K-4, snack provided)

RH Day 1, 11:45 AM – 2:15 PM ▪ Yom Kippur, 1:15 PM - 3:45 PM  
*SMP classrooms, last ½ hr in Grossman Chapel*

This program combines holiday-appropriate crafts, stories, games, skits and tefillah (prayer.) You must **pre-register AND pre-pay**, using the enclosed form. **Children must be pre-registered to attend.**

#### WHAT IS TASHLICH?

On the Second Day of Rosh Hashanah, Jews gather at a flowing body of water to symbolically toss our sins away, using breadcrumbs to represent our sins. We recite brief prayers about the experience of forgiveness, asking God to return us to our tradition refreshed for the new year. At Adath we offer two opportunities to do Tashlich as a group:
