

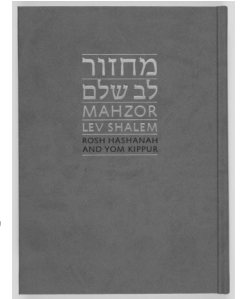

- You only need to write one (1) check, made payable to Adath, to cover all High Holy Days requests (guest tickets, etrog & lulov, etc.)
- ***Members who still owe dues, fees or Building Fund pledges from the last fiscal year, which ended May 31, 2011, must call the Executive Director, Bernie Goldblatt, 952.545.2424, before their tickets can be mailed.***
- For security reasons, you ***MUST*** have a ticket to enter the building.
- Please be considerate and refrain from wearing perfume or other scented products when you come to High Holy Day services.
- Please do not bring electronic devices into the building, as their use on the holidays is not appropriate.

NON-MEMBERS

Cost: \$250 per ticket, payable in advance.

A person who is not a member of Adath Jeshurun Congregation may purchase tickets. If the person decides to join the congregation during the year, the ticket price may be applied toward membership dues.

CHILDREN 13-30 YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE *LIVING IN PARENT'S HOME*

Cost: Free tickets as part of their parent's membership.

CHILDREN *NOT* LIVING AT HOME (Married or Unmarried)

Cost: \$95.00 per ticket

Faith and Doubt at Ground Zero

Local congregations join together for this special Selichot program and service, in honor of the tenth anniversary of 9/11 and as we prepare ourselves for the coming High Holy Days. This year the community Selichot Service will be hosted by Adath Jeshurun.

What did America see on September 11? And how did it affect our notions of God, of evil, and of the potential for darkness within religion itself? Led by Rabbi Barry Cytron, we'll view an outstanding PBS Frontline film *Faith and Doubt at Ground Zero* by Helen Whitney. This extraordinary film includes interview with priests, rabbis, an Islamic scholar, a Middle East expert, a psychoanalyst and others.

The evening begins with havdalah, followed by the program and the traditional Selichot Service at 11:00 PM, with its first taste of High Holy Days prayer and melodies. Rabbi Michael Latz of Shir Tikvah Congregation will give a brief d'var Torah.

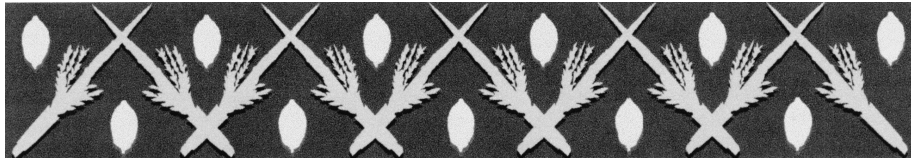

Build Your Own Sukkah!

More and more Adath families are building their own sukkot each year. This is a great project for friends and family members to do together. There are kits available, both locally and nationally, for simple, easy to construct sukkot of various sizes and prices to fit your needs.

Right here in the Twin Cities—The Jack Burke Sukkah Kit. This sukkah was lovingly designed by Jack Burke z”l (*may his memory be for a blessing*), father of Adath member Ellen Sue Parker, with the goal of creating a structure that is stable and sturdy, yet quick and easy to assemble and store. A frame of light-weight metal poles is covered with heavy canvas. There are several possibilities suggested for the roof, which is not provided. No tools are needed and detailed instructions come with the kit.

The Jack Burke Sukkah comes in a variety of colors and two standard sizes or it can be custom-designed. For details please contact Ellen Sue Parker at esp513@comcast.net or 763.591.9163. *Orders must be placed no later than **Friday, September 23**, to ensure delivery in time for Sukkot.*

High Holy Days Parking

No Parking Areas

No parking is permitted in the following areas. These are **FIRE LANES** for emergency vehicles only:

- Entire entry road from Hillside Lane to the building.
- Curbs on edges of parking lots.
- Curbs next to building.
- Drop-off areas at the main entrance and at the Gan Preschool entrance on the west end of the building.
(These are the circular areas in front of the doors.)

Handicapped—Special Parking Area



All persons with a handicapped certificate or tag, who are driving themselves, are welcome to use the designated handicapped parking spots and the handicapped reserved area by the west (Gan Preschool) entrance. If you use the Gan entrance, take the elevator up to the Sanctuary level.

Please leave the handicapped spaces for drivers who actually require them. If you are driving a person with a handicap permit, drop that person off at the front entrance and park in a regular parking space. There are 19 permanent spaces and an additional 32 handicapped parking spaces for the Holidays.

When Lots Are Full

When our on-site lots are full, you may park on Lindbergh Drive in accordance with the signs or in the overflow lots listed below and use the shuttle bus service.

Shuttle Bus

1st and 2nd days of ROSH HASHANAH

Shuttle service will be available from the east parking lot of Westwood Lutheran Church, 9001 Cedar Lake Road, (three blocks east of Highway 169) to the Adath main entrance. Please enter the church parking lot on the east side. (See the schedule below.)

KOL NIDRE AND YOM KIPPUR

Adath will provide shuttle service from the Hopkins High School main parking lot (off Lindbergh Drive) to the Adath main entrance.

High Holy Days Parking—Continued

Temporary Exit

There is a temporary exit on the east side of Adath's parking lot which will be open only during the Aleph and Bet changeover period. This exit is used by special permission of the Minnetonka City Council, only during the High Holy Days. **No entrance will be allowed at this opening** and no parking is allowed on the residential street (Windsor Lake Lane) between Windsor Lake Drive and the temporary exit.

Cars exiting the Adath lot through this temporary exit will be directed to turn right on Windsor Lake Drive for one block and then directed back to Lindbergh Drive.

**All cars must enter using the driveway on Hillside Lane.
Do not attempt to enter through the temporary exit.**

Please note there is one hour between the end of the Aleph service and the beginning of the Bet Musaf service. We urge congregants not to arrive early for the Bet Musaf service so the Aleph congregants have time to clear the parking lots. Note: On Kol Nidre the break between the Aleph and Bet services is only 45 minutes.

NOTE: The Minnetonka Police will be posting temporary no parking signs on some residential streets. This is to allow fire truck access, as these streets are too narrow for parking on both sides.

Do you need a ride to services?

YAD SIMA TOVA, Adath's Caring Community, has a limited number of volunteers available to provide transportation to Adath members who need a ride to High Holy Days services.
